Dear Comrades:

I've had an interesting two years at attempting to solve our declining membership problems and introducing new and innovative suggestions to assist each and every branch.

As one of your Vice Presidents and the chair of Leadership & Development, my eyes have been opened to the resistance to change within our own ranks. This resistance both surprises me and disheartens me with regard to the success of the Legion as a whole.

Comrades, I hail from a very successful and very rural branch of the RCL. I know full well and understand what it takes to make a failing branch become successful. I am very aware of the many years of dedication and many years of successful cooperation within the working executive and volunteers of a Branch on a regular basis. Furthermore, recruitment of new and interesting members is **THE** most important issue for every single one of us. The biggest downfall, clearly obvious to me, is on our recruitment side.

There have been several branches within our Command that have reported significant increases in membership.

WHY?

The **NUMBER ONE REASON** that these failing branches have turned around their fortunes is.....

They have elected a new and positively inclined executive!

Presidents and Executive members that have been in place for more than two or three terms have a tendency of becoming redundant and uneducated. What I mean is that many, many secretaries do not do the complete job for their respective branch and that many Presidents in place for more than three terms tend to disregard and dismiss the importance of attending Zone and District Meetings. Even long serving executive members are to blame for not making room for new, young and upcoming members to become interested in joining the executive of the branch. Long serving Zone and District Commanders certainly do the Legion no service when they simply can not communicate the new and upcoming changes and desires of the membership on a whole. There is good reason we have elections.

Some reminding and training should be in order to ensure that branches are complying with bylaws and doing the best they can to recruit new members and retain volunteers. When a president, new or old, is sworn in at the beginning of the term they are about to serve, they swear an oath to attend all Zone and District Meetings. Yet, this is not happening at many meetings. This has to change. Send a Vice President or Executive Member to collect information. But above all, SEND SOMEBODY!

I believe what is happening to us is that we have become complacent in thinking that we are doing everything we possibly can to save our individual branches and that most of us are not opening our eyes to the new reality of the world upon us today.

Your branch is very likely one of the 1700 plus branches left in the country that is the centre of your small town and sometimes the only hall and funeral gathering place for miles around. It is likely the only bar around too. Hmmmm. What to do?

Here is a plan that I've thought of for quite some time now and reflects the need for community involvement. Even if your branch is one of the "Big City" branches, this works. Some branches have actually started using this sort of technique to increase their membership with some notable success.

It will be incumbent upon the President and the executive of the branch to request the assistance of the "Higher Ups" of Command to attend their branch in a "Membership Drive". They will also have to move to spend a little money for an advertising budget. Your District Commander has the money to travel to your branch and attend just such an event. He or She would be the perfect person to have attending in uniform to answer any kind of questions that might be thrown at the membership by the public.

A branch might choose a weekend in June or perhaps September to hold a "Drive". These months hold the most promise for retaining persons who might wish to "sign up" and/or help your branch for a while. The "Drive" should entail a free offering to the public to come into the branch or onto Branch property and enjoy an afternoon or such. The "Free" offering could be as simple

as free hotdogs or burgers on a BBQ. Perogies if your branch is so inclined. Maybe even free magazines? How about Pie? Elephant Ears? Headcheese? Pogo's? Pickled Beets? You name it!.....How about a badminton tournament? The sky's the limit.

If your branch can afford it, offer one free beer to all over 19 years of age that are interested in joining.

Regardless, the idea is to generate a significant amount of interest in coming to the Branch within the single day for recruitment. Throw the doors open and welcome everybody in to the branch. Traffic is the intent here! Lots of it! Make sure to have a pile of Membership Applications on hand! And make damned sure that they are up to date! Drives like this are certainly nothing new, but I really haven't seen anything like this for a very long time. It might just be that the younger generation doesn't know what to make of these sorts of things. It will be up to you to generate their interest.

Another good thing to ensure is that your branch has full WIFI capability! Rest assured, no matter where your target audience is, (parking lot or in the bar or hall) they will be looking to be connected in any way, shape or form. This is not to be underestimated!

Back to the reason you need your District Commander or other "Higher Ups" present. When somebody asks a question like "What's in it for me?" You really need the experience of one of the Command members to assist your executive here. Nobody knows your community quite like you do, but nobody knows the Legion changes like your District Commander should.

Another solid reason for asking the District Commander or other "Higher Ups" to be there is for the sheer authority of the position they hold. These people are looked upon by the membership and public as authority figures that are elected to high positions and they hold considerable sway when it comes to public opinion and media attention. They should also know how to handle the media far better than anybody without knowledge of attending conventions. There is considerable weight on the shoulders of these elected officials. **Make them use it!**

Comrades, it is my wish to see each and every one of your branches succeed in today's world. To do that, each Branch needs to make changes that are not always comfortable and sometimes downright different. As we age, we will all balk at change. But without it, our local Branches will continue to suffer a very devastating, painful and slow decline. Yours may well be one of them.

Leadership and Development is exactly what it sounds like. Without strong leadership and continual development, we will suffer an agonizing defeat like many other service organizations have seen. I, for one, would very much like to see the good work of the Royal Canadian Legion continue in all of our towns and cities across our nation. Our Veterans and their families deserve every ounce of support they can get from us.

Start making a change!

Attend your Zone and District Meetings.

Budget your branch finances so that you can send a delegate or two to Provincial and Dominion Command Conventions! It's not cheap to send a delegate or two to a Dominion Convention, but the rewards can be eye opening and astronomical to a struggling branch.

Your President or his/her representative **MUST** attend all Zone and District Meetings.

Budget, Budget, Budget! Send your people! Start with a Provincial Convention. Budget for a Dominion Convention.

Pay Attention folks. Without your participation, we become very weak.

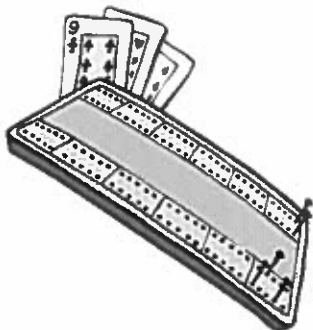

VETERANS TRANSITION PROGRAM

PURPOSE

The Veterans Transition Program is a series of group sessions in which veterans help veterans transition to civilian life with guidance from trained clinicians.

The group work involves communications skill development, career exploration and counseling, as well as Life Review and Group Action Process exercises to help participants process and move beyond any trauma injuries in a supportive, structured and safe environment.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- Relief from persisting stress reactions including:
 - i. reduced trauma symptoms
 - ii. decreased depression
 - iii. increased self-esteem
- Recover personal resiliency
- Identify life and career goals
- Transition military skills into successful civilian life
- Enhance relationships with significant others (families, partners, spouses, children)

OBJECTIVES

- Enable soldiers to “drop the baggage” of operational stress
- Provide tools to be successful and productive in civilian life

DATES

April 28 – May 1 (Fri 9:00am – Mon 4:30pm)
May 12 - 15 (Fri 9:00 am – Mon 4:30pm)
May 20 - 21 (Sat 9:00 am – Sun 4:30pm)

Participants must arrive no later than 9 AM of the first day of each phase. Contact Jenna (details below) for early/out-of-town arrival. Sessions proceed until 8:00 PM every day except for the final day of each phase.

REGISTRATION

- Participants must be able to attend all 10 days of the program
- Participants must undergo an informal intake interview to ensure suitability for the program

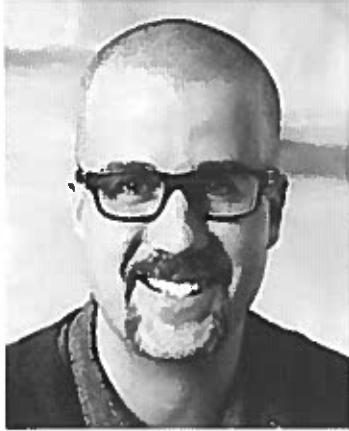

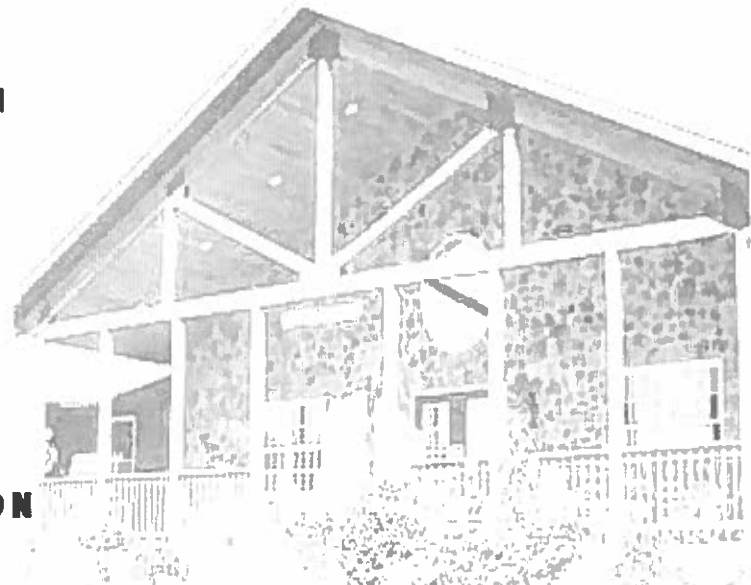

LOCATION & ACCOMMODATION

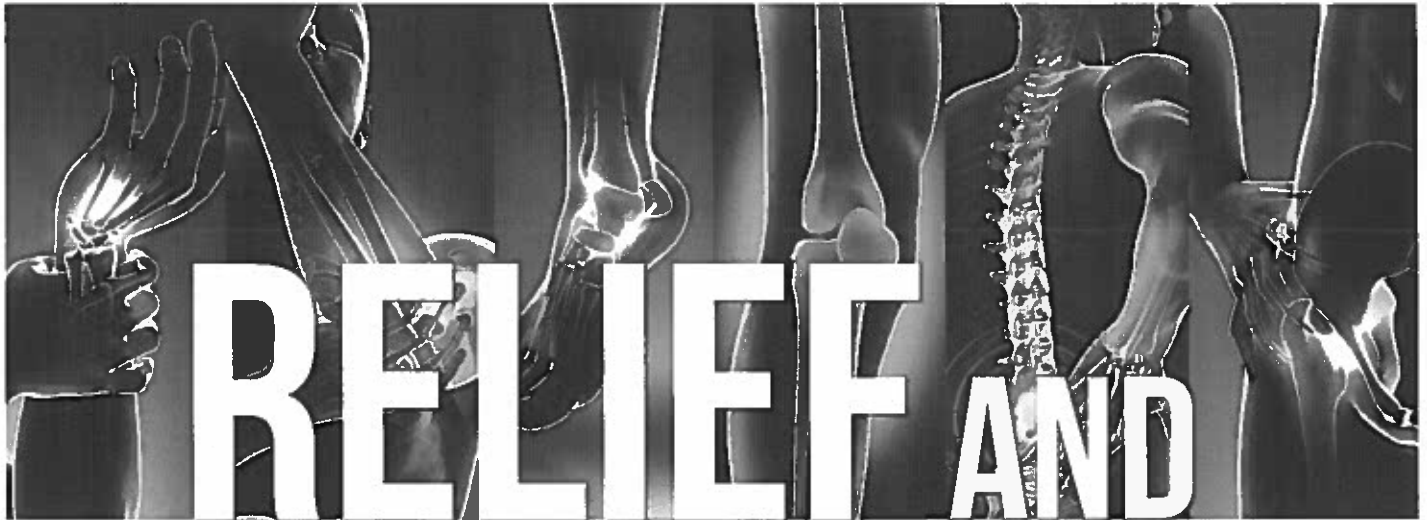
The program will be held at a retreat centre located roughly 80 minutes east of Winnipeg, MB. Individual rooms are provided, along with a private meeting space.

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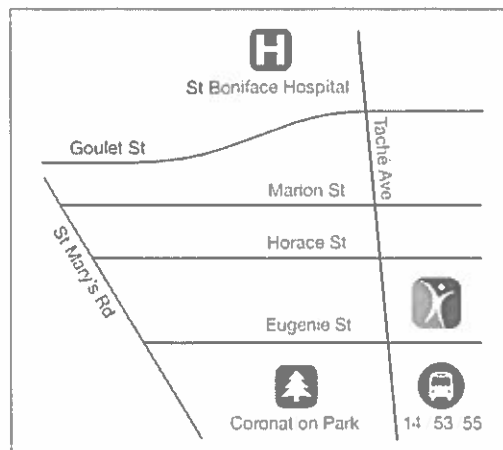

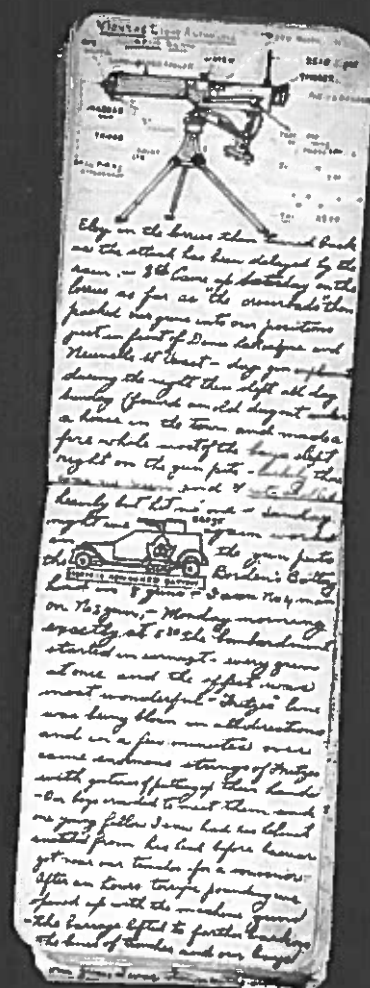

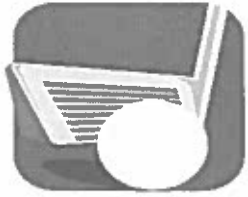
