1. The Royal Canadian Legion as defined by our Purposes and Objects, and our Articles of Faith is a fraternal veteran's organization based on comradeship and service to our Nation. In any organization, problems and disputes arise. To deal with these, Article III of our General By-Laws provides a formal resolution mechanism. Face-to-face discussion and compromises are all less formal means to resolve issues and should be considered as alternatives to formal action. However, where situations cannot be resolved amicably, a complaint may be lodged to seek resolution. Section 304 of The General By-Laws should be consulted to ensure that problems are dealt with efficiently and expeditiously.
